

THE FOLLOWING CHANGES TO CANAL ZONE REGULATIONS ARE TO BECOME EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 1977:

Page IV, first paragraph: strike the words "General Class test" from the last sentence and add the word examinations.

Page IV, second paragraph: strike the words "General Class FCC test" and add the word examination. In the fourth line, strike "General Class license or higher," and add license at the same level as the test being administered or higher.

PLEASE MAKE THESE CHANGES TO YOUR REGULATION BOOKLET:

Section 1.32 (a) line out "excluding licenses of the Novice or Technician classes."

Section 1.32 (e) strike out "except a former holder of an amateur license of any class issued by any agency of the United States Government, military or civilian."

Section 1.34 (e) (1) change 75 watts to 250 watts. Add: "All amateurs will abide by this input power when using these frequencies."

Section 1.34 (e) (2) (c) change 21.100 to 21.200 to 21.100 to 21.250.

Section 1.37 (a) strike out the words "except the Novice class,"

Section 1.37 (f) strike out the word "not" and add "every two years upon successful completion of the Novice class re-examination."

Section 1.39 (a) strike out all words after VCC license.

Section 1.42 strike out the second sentence "Exception: . . . in the Canal Zone."

Section 1.43 (1) At present there is no fee, but this may be only temporary. Make a footnote to that effect. Sentence 4 of this section will now read "An FCC examination will be used in all cases."

Section 1.43 (2) (b) strike out completely.

Section 1.44 (a) strike out everything in this paragraph after the word filed.

Section 1.45 (c) strike the words "If furnished by applicant". In its place write "For the Novice Test."

Section 1.51 strike (other than FCC Conditional class).

Section 1.82 strike complete section and add: "Pleasure boats equipped with 2 meter band Amateur Radio equipment may be used in water adjacent to but not in the Canal proper, with the approval of the coordinator. All water craft laying at anchor or docked within the Canal Zone will be considered a fixed station. Amateurs who hold FCC licenses may transmit from these watercraft after receiving temporary Amateur Radio licenses from the coordinator."
